It is well worth mentioning to everyone the importance of supporting our Association by encouraging everyone to acquire their Bowhunting Proficiency Certificate (BPC), even if you are not a bowhunter.

Having as many members as possible holding a BPC is important for our Association as it is a numbers game when it comes to State governments and

other organisations that want to change the way things are done.

The process is not a difficult one as the majority of ABA clubs have their own committees with a BPC instructor who will run prospective members through the steps to gain the BPC accreditation.

Once you have the BPC, you have it for the term of your ABA membership, so please seek out your BPC instructor in your club and have a talk to them.

A number of years ago, our Association started a process to have bowhunting for fish introduced into NSW.

It took a great deal of manpower to approach the Government and put our case forward to them, and after some time it actually happened. Now. all NSW ABA members have the opportunity to bow fish. South Australia also has the same opportunity.

There used to be Bow fishing in Victoria some years ago, but the rules changed at the stroke of a pen, so to speak, and some Victorian members are asking whether we can do the same as the other states and get back the legal opportunity to bow fish in Victoria. So, we will be putting our heads together to see what can be done to bring this task into being.

Above all else please keep getting out there looking for those elusive feral animals and putting your claims in. Stay safe!

### SHOOTING A CLICKER

Il international-level archers who compete with a recurve bar utilise a clicker. A clicker serves a trio of critical functions: It provide a draw length check, a tension check at full draw, and most importantly a shot trigger. Clickers have been part of the recurve armoury for a long time. FRED LEDER, a machine tool maker from Cincinnati was the inventor and from 1957 it gradually became a regular accessory on recurve bows in American competition. In fact, Earl Hoyt, the founder of Hoyt archery, became the first to commercially produce the clicker.

Obviously, the clicker ensures that the exact length of arrow is drawn, which is imperative to guarantee precise poundage and hopefully prevent high and low scoring arrows.

It also puts the drawing arm, and the holding arm in a uniform tension state, which is also

a very necessary precursor of fluency of execution. Finally, the fall of the clicker blade provides the sound cue for release. While it is not the unanticipated action a compound release aid provides, it does certainly help defeat the effects of a commanded shot referred to as IBF: impact bracing factor.

Sadly, for all the positives attributes it offers, recurve shooters overall tend to have a love/hate relationship with this narrow, quite inexpensive, piece of metal.

Passage through the clicker is a vital aspect of form and execution, and fluency is a hallmark of the world's elite. The efficiency with which the Korean recurvers excute past the clicker at an average of a round 3 seconds, sometimes less, is simply a joy to behold, for an old archer like myself, who in my prime, the hold was often 15, 20, or even more seconds.

So the logical question arising from all this information is, "what form strategies are these champions bringing to bear to facilitate such fluency?

Clearly with the high poundage archers are utilising today, a swift, fluent, clicker passage is critical, as an extended hold can only invite bow movement and a lesser aim and strained release.

The general consensus among these elite is that a push and pull

clicker procedure is the norm, and the logic of this approach is easy to comprehend. Clearly there has to be a pulling motion in order to anchor, which will proceed following the aim. The line is established and the scapular action as the elbow moves around to emphasise that line provides the pull. The pushing motion at the target comes from the front shoulder and is imperative, as it not

only assists clicker passage, it prevents any collapsing at full draw.

Most recurves leave just a millimetre so left to expand through the clicker, simply because there is a need for just a minimum of expansion to produce the fall of the clicker blade.

It goes without underlining that this coordinated push-pull method needs intense practice, best done initially at a bank vale up dose

in order to regularly produce that needed efficiency. Just as one does when working on anticipation, the nest drill is to shoot at a large target up close.

A drill is always used, and one

I've written about previously, was passed on to me by the great American archer ED ELIASON.

It is widely practiced by upper echelon performers. Ed would draw past the clicker with his pull pull expansion, and then continue that hold and expansion for a number of seconds and let down. In this way, the archer is actually strengthening that area just past the clicker, so teat normal expansion is not under stress during actual shooting situations. Some archers (I was one ) find having other clickers going off around them a struggle, and the only real remedy is to practice with other archers as often as possible. It is an annoying trait which needs to be practiced. Good shooting all you ambitious recurvers and newcomers to our great sport.

### CLEAR SKIES AND WARM SUNSHINE WERE THE ORDER OF THE DAY AS WE HEADED TOWARD NANANGO FOR THE 5TH ANNUAL TAA NATIONAL MUSTER 2022 AT THE BARAMBAH BOWHUNTERS AND FIELD ARCHERS INC. OVER THE WEEKEND OF OCTOBER 29/30.

Some of us were fortunate enough to be able to set up camp on Thursday and when we arrived, just after lunch, there was already two sites set up in the dog camping area, and a few others scattered around the rest of the site. Others trickled in during the afternoon, and a couple of campers were only just setting up as a storm blew in. It rained for about 15 minutes, and that was all the rain we were to have the entire weekend!

Friday morning dawn came with beautiful blue skies. The night had been cool and it was warming up very quickly, so we waited until mid-afternoon to head over to the practice butts for a couple of shots in the shade.

Saturday morning Muster was called at 8.30am, where the shoot director gives instruction for the day's events. There was an archer from Mildura VIC; some came from the Snowy Mountains, Illawarra,



Sydney, Newcastle, Coffs Harbour and Tenterfield regions of NSW. While Qld was well represented from Chinchilla, Toowoomba, Gladstone to Gympie, Kingaroy, Sunshine Coast, Brisbane, and the Gold Coast. A total of 106 archers, the biggest turnout for quite some time. The TAA Titles shoot has a format for each event, and you got to choose in which order these events are done.

There was also an Archery Crafters Guild Display set up for people to display various wares of traditional archery-related items, from broadheads through to armour and leather goods which was open for all to browse through over the weekend.

Our group headed up past the running pig onto what was the second range of targets, 11-20. There was orange sign to designate the target, then orange tangs on steel pegs for adult and juniors, with a pink tang for the cubs. The courses were set up with nine targets either side of the track and one at the end, in a loop, so they were very social.

The novelty events are scored as 10 for A and B zone and 5 for the rest of body, so both groups completed and scored the event together. We then set for camp to have a quick refreshing drink.

As we walked onto our second course there was a collection of people, there were three targets quite close, with the group on target one scoring, so we didn't wait long. It was good being able to talk to other groups along the track to each target, which on this course were an antelope, ram, baboon, three pigs from three separate pegs, a hyena, chameleon, and a skunk.

After the events, we all headed back to our respective camps. They ran the axe and knife events while the cooks were preparing the dinner in the clubhouse kitchen.

There was live entertainment, an acoustic duo 'Miss Fee-Rose' and 'Mikey-O' (also an archer) covering many songs and finishing around 9.30pm, which was just about the time we were heading to bed after enjoying a meal with friends and a couple of nightcaps in camp.

Sunday morning was sunny once again, with a slight breeze today, and as there was no muster



we could go out at any time, so our group headed for the Hunt Round first, however there were a few groups waiting, so we went to the field course.

After the events, everyone started to gather in the clubhouse forthe raffle draw, which had been very well supported with over 80 items on the tables. Before too long we were onto the presentations and it was great to see Juniors in both longbow and recurve and so many cubs shooting, which keeps the sport growing.

There are no shoots confirmed on the Proposed Calendar (at time of writing due to clubs awaiting AGM's) for Feb 2023/ Mar 2023, another good time for reflection from past shoots. I have been advised that the Traditional shoot is back on at NAFA over the Easter weekend April 8/9 which is great news.

s most clubs try to think outside the box to retain and obtain new members to their clubs, Renegade Bowmen has developed a fun social weekend away.



The one thing we didn't think about was the level of the Wivenhoe dam leading up to the event. Like the rest of Australia,




we'd had good rain fall leading into October.



### What's your favourite archery memory?
